Objectives:

- Hears and says the initial sounds in words.
- Can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together.
- Can name and sound the letters of the alphabet.

Writing

Objectives:

- Gives meaning to marks they make as they draw, write and paint.
- Uses some letters to communicate meaning, representing some of these sounds correctly and in sequence.
- Writes own name and other things such as labels and captions.

Maths

Objectives:

- Recites numbers in order to 10.
- Shows an interest in representing numbers.
- Recognises numerals 1-5.
- Counts objects to 10 and beginning to count beyond 10.
- Beginning to use mathematical names for 2D and 3D shapes and mathematical terms to describe them.
- Selects a particular named shape.
