### Year 1

In Year 1 this week in maths we have been measuring using cubes, pencils and hand spans. We have also started to estimate how long or tall an object is. The children have also been improving their hand-eye coordination by playing throwing and catching games.

### **EYFS**

#### <u>Nursery:</u>

This week, the children in Nursery celebrated Shrove Tuesday by making their own pancakes. They enjoyed making the pancake mixture but they liked eating the pancakes more, especially since they had so many delicious toppings to choose from!

#### Reception:

This week we have really enjoyed learning about the story of The Gingerbread Man. We had great fun making and tasting our own gingerbread men! We have also started writing gingerbread recipes to create a recipe book for our new Baker's Shop role play area.





## Year 2

This week Year 2 have been looking at the absorbency of different materials and have been comparing which materials are best to clean up after spilling water. We have also been using our observational skills to sketch the Titanic, making sure we look carefully at the shape and size of the different parts.

#### Year 3

In Year 3 this week we have been grouping rocks by their properties and learning what our new vocabulary permeable, durable and density means. We investigated which rocks have a high or low density by placing them in water to see whether they float or sink. We were very surprised as we watched a tiny piece of slate sink to the bottom of the container.



This week Year 4 have continued their learning on sound. We made string telephones to demonstrate how sound travels over distance and how this can be affected by the tightness and length of the string.









## Year 5

As part of our new book focus, Year 5 have been researching the Vikings so that we can write an information text about them and use our subject knowledge when discussing Beowulf in class. Outside the classroom, Year 5 beat our local rivals St John's in a tag rugby competition where we showed superb skills and respect towards our opposition. Well done everybody!

# Year 6

This week we have been learning about Ancient Greek gods and goddesses and their importance in Greek history. We have used our learning to begin to design our own characters so that we can create our own myths and legends in our writing lessons. We have also had lots of discussion around how much children use social media and mobile phones, and are using this to write a discussion about whether children should be banned from mobile phones altogether. We have also displayed our Greek pots for everyone to see.
