

## <u>Autumn Term 3 – Nursery</u> <u>2022-2023</u>

## <u>Reading</u>

We will be continuing to focus on how we read a book & the names of the different parts of a book. We will be reading fiction and non-fiction books. We will be engaging in conversations about stories. Children will be developing their phonological awareness when looking at books too.

## <u>Writing</u>

In Writing we will continue to focus on making marks and talking about them in all areas of provision. We will be using some of our print & letter knowledge in our early writing e.g. writing a pretend list or writing an initial sound for a word we know. We will be copying over or writing our first names too. Some children will be focusing on writing letters that are accurately formed.

#### <u>Maths</u>

In Maths we will be reciting, counting, subitising and recognising numbers. The children will be describing shapes. We will start to solve real life maths problems in context. Children will be exploring position, routes and how to describe them.

# Our topic is – Who lives in a house like this?

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Beginning to understand how others are feeling
- Remembering and following rules independently
- Helping to find solutions to conflicts
- Developing appropriate ways of being assertive
- Showing more confidence in unfamiliar situations

Communication and Language

- Developing communication and use of the correct tense
- Expressing our own points of view
- Being able to debate with friends
- Continuing a conversation taking turns
- Understanding 'why?' questions

### Physical

- Climbing different apparatus safely
- Moving to music and rhythm
- Remembering sequences of movement in dance and music
- Collaborating with others to manage large items
- Showing a preference for a dominant hand
- Making healthy choices – about food, drink and activities

Understanding the World

- Exploring materials with similar properties
- Planting seeds and caring for them
- Exploring and talking about forces we can feel
- Talking about changes that we can see
- Remembering the importance of caring for living things (including animals and plants)

#### **Expressive Arts**

- Joining different materials
- Exploring textures
- Showing emotions through drawings
- Responding to what we have heard or seen
- Making imaginative and more complex 'small worlds' in provision
- Playing instruments with more control
- Singing the melody of familiar songs
