EYFS

Nursery:

This week in Nursery we have been reading the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. We even went on our very own bear hunt in the school nature garden! The children had a great time squelching in the mud and enjoyed finding their own little bears.

Reception:

This week, Reception have been learning their number bonds to 10. We have been using cubes and Numicon to show our number bonds in a part-whole model. We have also had fun learning a song called "I Know My Number Bonds".

Year 1

In Year 1 this week we have been learning about mental health and have discussed what makes us fantastic. The children have created some work that celebrates their individuality.



Year 2

This week Year 2 have been learning about how materials can change shape. We have looked at a variety of everyday objects and have tested them to see if we can bend, stretch, twist and/or squash them.







Year 3

In Year 3 this week we have been learning about why the River Nile was so important to the Ancient Egyptians. The children then recorded down the facts they had learnt. In our Writing lessons we have been retelling the story of Stone Age Boy using prepositions, adverbials and dialogue.

Year 4

This week Year 4 have continued their Science work on how sound is made and how it travels. We experimented with wind, string and percussion instruments to see how they made sound and how we can alter the pitch in them. We have been learning about how sound travels through our ear and will be writing an explanation text about this next week.









Year 5

This week we have looked at wealth and whether money really does make the world go round. Using a budget, the children were then tasked with creating and mapping out their own state of the art location to rival the likes of Dubai, Hong Kong and New York. They had to think carefully about the costs and the location of the special features they included.

Year 6

This week Year 6 began to put the finishing touches to their Greek pots. They carefully mixed colours and designed patterns to give them an authentic look. We look forward to seeing the finishing pots next week.
