Parent/Carer Feedback

We would like to share with you the analysis from our latest parent/carer survey (72 parents completed the survey). Thank you to everyone who completed the survey we are overwhelmed by your support for Newton Hill. Your feedback is extremely important to us and we will endeavour to act on your feedback to continue to improve.

- 100% of parents/carers felt that their child was happy at school, their child felt safe and that their child was well looked after.
- 97% of parents felt that their child was making good progress and was taught well.
- 94% felt that children behaved well.
- 93% felt that the school was well led and managed.
- 90% commented that they were happy with information received on progress.
- With regards to bullying- 31% parents/carers could not comment as they have not had any issues and 65% agreed that the school deals with any issues well.
- 83% of parents felt that homework was appropriate.
- 99% of parents would recommend our school.

School Expansion update:

As we move into the second half of the term the new school block is nearing completion, the main structural elements are now complete and the internal finishes, external works and landscaping are progressing well. Completion of the works is expected **after** the Easter Holidays.

The scheme has had significant challenges dealing with redundant mine workings below the site, which had to be addressed before works progressed on site – the new extension will be a valuable addition to the school providing the Local Authority with additional capacity to meet the pupil places within the catchment through new teaching and support spaces. The new block will comprise of six new classrooms, a baking resource room, a library area, a staffroom and new toilet facilities. The outside area will continue to be developed and it will eventually provide two playing fields. Once this is complete, the additional gates for accessing school will be open again.
