School Updates

Thank you to everyone who is following the government guidance and information from school. It is everyone's responsibility to follow the rules from the government and we need to keep reminding each other of what the rules are and why these rules are in place. We must protect everyone in our community as much as possible.

School Gates

Polite reminder: Please ensure you respect and follow social distancing rules when waiting to drop off and collect your child. We also ask that when speaking to staff at the school gates you respect the 2-metre distance. Staff will wear visors at the school gates. To reduce the number of people we would like to remind you that it is only one parent/carer at drop off and collection. If you are travelling in a car, please take extra care when dropping off and collecting your child/children. We also ask that you respect our neighbours by not blocking driveways.

Actions you can take to help

Do not send your child to school if they are showing symptoms OR someone in their household is showing symptoms. Please let school know if your child is not attending. The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- **a high temperature** – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- **a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste** – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

[Arrange a test](#) if you or your child develops symptoms. Inform school of the results. If the test is positive, follow [guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus \(COVID-19\) infection](#), and engage with the NHS Test and Trace process. If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result. **Please contact school if you need any help.**

For this half term children will have 1 PE session which will be outside. We are asking for children to come to school in their PE kit (a plain white T shirt, plain blue/black shorts, a plain tracksuit or plain joggers/jumper and trainers) on their allocated day, more information will follow from class teachers. PE will start next week.</p> <p>Future closures: Class work will be sent via parent hub and communication will be via the hub and the class email system.</p>

Become a Parent Governor

We are looking for a parent to join our Governing Body. School governors play a key role in raising school standards and monitoring performance. They hold senior leadership to account and make important decisions covering issues such as policy making, site management, the school's budget and the curriculum. Governors support the school in a variety of ways in addition to attending governing body meetings. It is a very important and worthwhile job! Anyone can become a governor; the only requirement is that you have the enthusiasm and desire to make a difference.

The Governing Body has undertaken a skills audit and has established that it would be desirable for a new governor to possess skills/experience relating to **Human Resources and/or legal experience**. Please be aware however, that it is not essential that you have these skills in order to become a parent governor. Training and support is available for new and existing governors and is free of charge. There would be an expectation for governors to attend training to develop their skills to support the work of the Governing Body.

School Governors serve for a four-year term of office. However, should your circumstances change, as a volunteer, you can resign at any time. The average time commitment is 10-15 hours per term. This includes meetings, background reading and school visits.
