As you will be aware the school was inspected over the 12th and 13th of January. It is a require Ofsted for parents and carers to have access to the full report this has been uploaded onto o website for you at <u>www.newtonhill.wakefield.sch.uk</u>. We were disappointed with the overall judgement which states that the school requires furth improvement. The Ofsted team identified some key areas for us to work at which as the repc had already been identified by the leadership team of the school. I have outlined some of the below along with some key information about how the school is already taking action to addu these.

- 1. Changes to staff as you will be aware, over the last 2 years there has been son, ..., .gr changes to staffing, both at leadership and class teacher level. The governors of the so have been keen to secure a permanent structure for the school and we feel with the s staffing we now have this can be actioned.
- 2. Improving the quality of teaching based on the sample of lessons that inspectors saw were some key themes identified that our staff are now responding to. As the report we are in still in the early phase of introducing some new teaching and learning strate which will address these issues. Again as the report states, staff are embracing these positively and their confidence is increasing.
- 3. Our KS2 outcomes were disappointing. As you will be aware from national media cove these were new and more challenging standards. KS2 staff are now more aware of the expectations for the end of year 6, we have every confidence that outcomes will impr year. Last year our performance in writing was in line with national outcomes and we working hard to ensure that our KS2 curriculum secures similar improvement for read maths.
- 4. Behaviour the behaviour of children at break time, lunchtime and around the schoo remains a strength of Newton Hill. Inspectors noted that learning behaviour (low leve disruption) in lower KS2 could be improved in order for children to maximise learning Staff are revisiting our expectations and Golden Rules with children daily so that child always encouraged to be the best that they can be
