## **Reading**

#### Sun safety



With the weather becoming warmer it is important to us that your child is kept safe in the sun. Children can bring in sun hats and sunglasses to wear outside and we will explain to the children about the importance of taking time out from the sun. We also ask that sun cream is applied before your child comes to school and that, if they do bring any cream to school, it is in the form of a roll-on/stick and
