Coronavirus Update

Thank you to everyone who is complying with the rules – hands, face and space. Unfortunately, there are still parents who are not adhering to the social distancing guidance. Therefore, as you know, we have asked all parents/carers to wear a mask or face covering when collecting/dropping off on school premises. This also applies to older children who are collecting. You must still keep a safe distance from other parents/carers and staff (2 metres) when waiting to collect/drop off.

LOCAL RESTRICTIONS FOR WAKEFIELD DISTRICT

The Government announced that additional restrictions will be in place for the Wakefield district from Wednesday, 14th October, alongside neighbouring areas who also have high rates of infection. Wakefield is confirmed as Local Alert Level 2 (high alert) on the Government's three tier alert system.

We've seen a surge in cases with 191.8 per 100,000 people now testing positive in Wakefield, compared to last week when it was 106.2 per 100,000.

Council urges parents to support social distancing

Wakefield Council is reminding parents and carers to continue to maintain social distancing during school drop-offs and pick-ups.

People are being asked to keep a 2m distance from others at the school gates as the district continues to face the ongoing challenges of Covid-19.

Cllr Margaret Isherwood, Cabinet Member for Children and Young People, said "We know schools are working tirelessly to do all they can to make them safe places for students and staff.

"We ask those who are taking or collecting children from school to continue to follow the 2m distancing rules to help avoid passing on this virus to others. These actions are so important, as they support communities in our district and help to keep schools open."

Anna Hartley, Wakefield Council's Director of Public Health, said: "We know parents and carers in our district want to do all they can to keep infection rates low "Face coverings can also be worn, as this reduces the chance of the virus being transmitted."

We will continue to monitor the situation and the social distancing rules that are expected from parents/carers when waiting to collect/drop off at school. If you are unable to comply with government rules to socially distance, and as a result put others at risk, you will be asked to wait at the school gate. We ask that you respect the rules and keep everyone safe. Please take extra care when walking to school and when waiting for the gates to open.

We have spoken to the children about how to keep safe and what is expected e.g. waiting patiently and being mindful of parked cars and we ask that you reiterate these messages at home. We have also asked our PCSO to support our school in monitoring the surrounding area ensuring cars are parked appropriately and that they do not block our neighbours' driveways.

School Updates

Learning Mentor

Mrs Dundas has started her role and is already enjoying being a part of NHCS. Mrs Dundas will be at the gates at home time over the next few weeks so that you can put a face to a name. If you would like to speak to Mrs Dundas please contact school.

NHCS Remote Learning Plan

If a class bubble had to close due to positive COVID test result, we would contact you via the parent hub in order for you to collect your child/children. If a bubble closed, children would need to remain at home for 14 days. We understand that this will be a difficult time for everyone.

During the closure we will continue to provide remote learning. On the day of closure, each child will take home resources and learning activities for the first and second closure day. From day 3 of the closure, further remote learning activities will be set. These will be sent out via parent hub and also be linked to our school website under the 'Pupil Zone' tab. The website pages will be made available once it has been confirmed that a bubble will need to close. Work will be set daily and it will be an expectation that you return work to school so that it can be marked by class teachers – this can be done via the class email system. Teachers will provide clear explanations for the learning to be completed at home and links to a variety of resources. We will also be in daily communication via email. We may also contact you by telephone as required.

Did you know?

- Children entitled to Free School Meals received £15 each week during school closures.
- Children received £105 over the summer holidays as part of the COVID Summer Food Fund
- If you are entitled to FSM and you have to isolate our school meals provider (ISS) will provide food hampers
- School also receives valuable additional funding which we can use to support your child.

School Gates

If you are travelling in a car, please take extra care when dropping off and collecting your child/children. We also ask that you respect our neighbours by not blocking driveways.

Actions you can take to help

Do not send your child to school if they are showing symptoms OR someone in their household is showing symptoms. Please let school know if your child is not attending. The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal
- Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

<u>Arrange a test</u> if you or your child develops symptoms. Inform school of the results. If the test is positive, follow guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection, and engage with the NHS

Test and Trace process. If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result. **Please contact school if you need any help.**
