Nursery:

Year 3

Last week in Art, we used clay to make Egyptian Cartouches. The children have been very arty recently - they also thoroughly enjoyed making Canopic Jars with mod-roc at our open morning!



Year 4

This week we have been learning to classify animals based on their similarities and differences. We have also designed and made Canopic jars which we can't wait to paint!

Year 5

Year 5 have been learning how to order and compare decimal numbers with up to three decimal places. This week we also started to learn our new samba routine linked to the countries we have focused on in our topic of slavery.



Year 6

This week, year 6 have been looking at adaptation in science and learning about how animals survive in their environments. We have been using our knowledge to try and work out whether animals could survive in a different environment - for example, could a polar bear survive in the desert?

School Expansion update:

As we move into the second half of the term the new school block is nearing completion, the main structural elements are now complete and the internal finishes, external works and landscaping are progressing well. Completion of the works is expected before the Easter Holidays.

The scheme has had significant challenges dealing with redundant mine workings below the site, which had to be addressed before works progressed on site – the new extension will be a valuable addition to the school providing the Local Authority with additional capacity to meet the pupil places within the catchment through new teaching and support spaces. The new block will comprise of six new classrooms, a baking resource room, a library area, a staffroom and new toilet facilities. The outside area will continue to be developed and it will eventually provide two playing fields. Once this is complete, the additional gates for accessing school will be open again.
