Our **English** Curriculum

Our **English** curriculum contributes to the **Spiritual** development of pupils by:

- Creative writing lessons
- Expressing beliefs, feelings, ideas and emotions through talk and writing
- Reading and writing in a number of settings
- Writing in response to first-hand experiences
- Reading poetry and great works of fiction
- Using and expressing their imaginations in reading, writing and speaking

Our English curriculum contributes to the Moral development of pupils by:

- Discussing and exploring points of views
- Exploring stories and other texts that present moral issues, as well as rules and law
- Exploring moral issues through reading, discussion, drama and role-play
- Presenting an argument through talk and writing
- Using persuasion in writing
- Taking part in class/school debates and expressing ideas confidently

Our **English** curriculum contributes to the **Social** development of pupils by:

- Debating and writing about social issues
- Using non-fiction texts as stimuli for writing or debate
- Reading a range of fiction set in social settings
- Presenting school based issues.
- Creating content aimed at a variety of audiences.
- Discussing, sharing and listening to ideas and points of views.
- Choosing favourite texts, through discussions and votes where appropriate
- Choosing a subject matter or purpose for writing.

Our English curriculum contributes to the Cultural development of pupils by:

- Exploring the origins of words and language
- Listening to, reading and discussing texts that challenge stereotypes.
- Taking part in productions and performances.
- Watching performances.
- Reading and listening to texts from a variety of cultures.
- Reading traditional and cultural tales, myths and legends.

Our Maths Curriculum

Our Maths curriculum contributes to the Spiritual development of pupils by:

- Exploring pattern, number, shape, space and measures in the world around them
- Using role play, concrete objects, structural apparatus and real-life situations
- Talking creatively using mathematical language
- Developing mathematical reasoning by talking about their learning and listening to the viewpoints of others.

Our **Science** curriculum contributes to the **Spiritual** development of pupils by:

- Expressing views and opinions, e.g. hypotheses, with confidence in a safe and supportive environment

- Finding out how medical research has changed and saved lives
- Finding out about how science-based charities promote and support health and well-being

- Working collaboratively
- Listening to the ideas and opinions of other e.g. theories and hypotheses

Our History curriculum contributes to the Spiritual development of pupils by:

Our **History** curriculum contributes to the **Moral** development of pupils by:

- Developing an understanding of the consequences of their behaviour and actions by exploring the historical impact of choices made by individuals and societies.
- Encouraging them to explore their own understanding of right and wrong when considering ethical dilemmas and decisions throughout history.
- Nurturing their sense of justice and fairness. Through the study of historical events such as civil rights movements, world wars etc., pupils learn about the consequences of prejudice, discrimination and injustice.

- Providing a platform to enhance social skills through collaborative fieldwork.
- Fostering discussions on diverse geographical topics between pupils and adults from varied religious, ethnic, and socio-economic backgrounds.
- Exploring geographical scenarios that involve cooperation, conflict resolution, and community engagement, such as disaster management or urban planning.
- Facilitating a better understanding of global interconnectedness, promoting empathy and respect towards people of different faiths, beliefs, and socio-economic backgrounds worldwide.
